PARK TO DISAPPEAR AT SCARBORO' BEACH

**Wreckers Soon to Start Tear-
ing Down Amusement
Places**

TO BE SITE OF RESIDENCES

Scarboro' Beach Park is to be dismantled. In another column appears an advertisement calling for tenders for the demolition of the old park, which a few years ago ranked with Hanlan's Point as one of the playgrounds of the city.

As had been planned when the land was bought during the "clean-up" deal, the Provident Investment Company, which now owns the property, intends to make the park into a real estate subdivision. The park comprises some 37 acres, and blue-prints showing it in streets already have been made. The necessary local improvements will be started, no doubt, next spring.

All the old amusements, the chute-the-chutes, the merry-go-round, the whirl of pleasure, will now disappear, and Scarboro' Beach Park, where for the past 14 years Toronto holiday crowds have disported themselves, will be no more. Only the boat-house and the bicycle track will be left as reminders of an amusement park that was left behind in the city's progress.

To Building Wreckers

Tenders for Demolition of Buildings at Scarborough Beach Park

The undersigned will receive tenders up to and including November 7, 1925, for the demolition and removal of the buildings hereinafter described and situate on the Scarborough Beach property, Queen Street East, Toronto, as follows:

Parcel No. 1.

Building known as grandstand and plank walk leading thereto and in front thereof.

Frame building known as clubhouse.

Frame building known as garage.

Located in what is known as the athletic field, together with the fences on the north and east sides of said athletic field.

(The wooden bicycle track in these grounds is not included in this advertisement.)

Brick dwelling, known as No. 2285 Queen Street East, and sheds to the north thereof.

Frame building, containing lavatories, situate south of brick dwelling.

Frame cottage with sheds, known as No. 2255 Queen Street East.

Parcel No. 2.

Buildings in the easterly part of the Scarborough Beach Amusement Park, known as electroscope, Johnstown Flood, whirl of pleasure, chutes structure, bumps, palmistry, refrigerator building, paint shop and two booths (except the pump and well houses) and the fence on the north side of the amusement park from the office building to McLean Avenue and along the west side of McLean Avenue.

The location of the buildings included in this parcel is shown enclosed in red on the plan which may be seen at the amusement park office on the property.

Parcel No. 3.

Buildings in the westerly part of the amusement park, including all buildings and the scenic structure on the north side of the amusement park situated to the west of the office building, except the transformer house, and on the west side of the park down to the lake, except the boat house, and the following structures to the east of the west walk, viz., booths 1 and 2, band shell and stage, picture machine house, tower, flag pole, also the fence on the north side of the amusement park from the office building to the west limit of the property and the fence south of the "Cascades," but not including the fence along the westerly limit of the park.

The location of the buildings included in this parcel is shown enclosed in yellow on the plan, which may be seen at the amusement park office on the property.

Parcel No. 4.

The building known as the Pavilion, situated on the lake front and shown in black on the above mentioned plan.
